


About Us

Bayou City Performing Arts was founded as the Montrose Singers, Inc. in November of 1979. Led by founding director Andy Mills, the Houston based men's chorus met with early successes marked by lavish productions at the Tower Theatre, performing with as many as 80 singing members. Recently the organization has expanded to include both the well-known Gay Men's Chorus of Houston and a new exciting addition: the Bayou City Women's Chorus. Both choruses now operate under the same corporate organization and umbrella name, Bayou City Performing Arts.

BCPA's 26 seasons of continuous activity have been distinguished by innumerable performance accomplishments. Among these successes were appearances at the Cultural Festival in Vancouver, British Columbia and the GALA Choruses conventions in Denver of 1992, San Jose in 2004. In 1998, GMCH made its second appearance with the Houston Symphony performing Schoenberg's Gurrelieder.

GMCH has performed regionally, nationally, and even internationally, representing the Houston community in cities throughout Texas, Colorado, Louisiana, Minnesota and Canada. The chorus has appeared in many internationally acclaimed performance venues. Local appearances have included the Alley Theatre, the 1894 Grand Opera Houston of Galveston, the Wortham Center' Cullen Theatre, Rich University's Stude Hall, the Hobby Center for the Performing Arts' Zilkha Hall, and Jones Hall.

National and international appearances have been staged at the Meyerson Symphony Center in Dallas, the Ted Mann Concert Hall in Minneapolis and the Place des Arts – Willifred-Peltier Concert Hall in Montreal. This December, the BCPA choruses performed for a second year in a row as the featured holiday concert at the International Festival Institute in Round Top, Texas.


BCPA continues its contributions to the body of choral literature through commissions, its 2003 release of its first holiday CD, *Grateful*, and the recent release of two new CD's: *Red, Hot, and Cole* – the music of Cole Porter and *MOSAIC*, a three-part collection of GMCH's favorite music.

Recent successes of the *Bayou City Performing Arts* have been widely credited to the appointment of its current Artistic and Managing Director, James Knapp, in 2001. Under his exceptional leadership, the men's chorus has grown to over 150 members. Having served as Artistic Director for his first four years, James accepted additional responsibilities in his appointment in 2005 to full-time Artistic and Managing Director.

Having been termed "the best face of diversity in Houston," BCPA is widely respected for community leadership in inclusion and diversity. BCPA continues to provide opportunities for a wide range of Houstonians, fulfilling its mission of excellence in music – coupled with unity and pride.

James Knapp

James Knapp is now in his fifth season as Artistic Director for the Bayou City Performing Arts, conducting both the Gay Men's Chorus of Houston and the newly formed Bayou City Women's Chorus. Originally from Rochester, New York, James holds degrees from Fredonia State University in New York, the Mozarteum Conservatory of Music in Salzburg, Austria, and a Master of Music from the University of Texas at Austin.



ed the featured choir at the 1996 International Church Music Festival in Coventry, England. His choirs have been heard on Houston's Classic Arts Radio in a performance of Brahms' A German Requiem, and in a televised performance of Handel's Messiah. In 1997 his Singspiration Singers won first prize in a national gospel symposium for their performance and interpretation of gospel music.

Prior to joining the staff of BCPA, James served for seven years as the Director of Music and Fine Arts Ministry at Sugar Land First United Methodist Church in metropolitan Houston. There, he conducted and administrated a musical and fine arts program with over 500 participants.

Before returning to Texas, he was the Director of Choral Activities at Aurora University in Aurora, Illinois, where he conducted the University Singers and the Fox Valley Festival Chorus. His academic teaching experience also includes positions held at the University of Texas at Austin and Northwest College of Houston.

His choirs have appeared at regional American Choral Directors Association Conventions, Texas Choral Directors Association Convention, the Moscow Philharmonic, and the Palaces of St. Petersburg Chamber Music and Choir Festival in Russia. Further, he has conduct-

James has appeared as a guest vocal soloist with the Salzburg Radio Choir, L'orchestra du Capitole de Toulouse, the Aspen Music Festival, the Munich Boys Choir, the Houston Gilbert and Sullivan Society, the Salzburg Opera, and the Fox Valley Symphony. As a vocal artist, James has performed throughout the United States and Europe, appearing in artist series in Germany, France, Italy and Austria. As a choral singer, James has performed with the Lyric Opera Chorus of Chicago and the Chicago Symphony Chorus.

He is an active adjudicator, clinician and conductor internationally and has presided over choral workshops in South Africa, Zimbabwe, Thailand and Singapore. James is an active member of Texas Choral Directors Association, American Choral Directors Association, American Guild of Organists, National Association of Teachers of Singing and the Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia Fraternity.







Carole FitzPatrick received her Bachelor's degree from the University of Texas and two Master's degrees from Yale, then moved to Europe in 1988. After engagements in Dortmund and Osnabrück, Germany, she joined the ensemble of the State Theater in Nuremberg. Her extensive opera repertoire during her 17 years there includes Mozart, Verdi, Puccini, Strauss and Wagner, having sung over 50 major roles in German opera houses, including Hannover, Mannheim, Duesseldorf and Berlin.

Her concert work has been extensive as well, including concert tours in France and Spain, and performances in Finland, Austria, the Czech Republic, Luxemburg, and Russia.

Since its inception, Ms. FitzPatrick has been a vocal advisor for the Nuremberg State Theater's Opera Studio for Young Singers, giving both master classes and private voice lessons to the participants.

She was selected by the City of Osnabrück as "Citizen of the Year" and was named by the professional magazine OpernWelt as one of its "Singer of the Year" candidates. Ms. Fitzpatrick returned to the U.S. in August 2005 and is currently assistant professor of voice at Arizona State University in Tempe, Arizona.
